Clothing & Footwear

- T-shirts

- Underwear

- At least one pair of jeans/pants

- Ball cap, bucket hat, or similar
- Socks

- Light sweater or pullover (can't be cozy without one; for extra warmth THAW has plenty of personal warming devices — from disposable to Bluetooth*)

Campsite Essentials

The gear you need in order to **AVOID** roughing it.

- Tent (unless you're RV or cabin camping)
- Ground cloth/tarp (goes under the tent)
- Tent poles, stakes, & guide lines
- Hammer/mallet (those stakes aren't going to drive themselves)
- Sleeping bag or sheets & blankets
- Pillow
- Sleep pad or air mattress
- Air pump (HALO as a portable power bank with air compressor)
- Camp chairs (the umbrella variety)
- Camp table (if campsite doesn't come with a picnic table)
- Rope/Clothesline
- Duct tape (Don't leave home without it!)
- Paracord/heavy string (cordage is everything in the great outdoors)
- Camp saw & hatchet (Do not cut limbs or trees in state/national parks)
- Knife/multi-tool (TRUE has the perfect one for you)
- Flashlights (NEBO has you covered)
- Headlamp (Check out NEBO's headlamps & cap-lights)
- Lantern (NEBO has your back for this one, too)
- Matches & lighter (TRUE has a cool rechargeable one)
- Insect control (SKEETER HAWK has some awesome solar and rechargeable solutions)
- Tarp/screen house (some campsites aren't shaded)
- Bucket (great for carrying toiletries to the shower or filled with water for fire control; try the NEBO BRITBUCKET for a collapsible, lighted option)

- Camp stove & fuel
- Tablecloth (it's sanitary and civilized at the same time)
- Cooler (hard-sided with a latch to keep critters out)
- Refillable water jug (2.5 - 5 gallons)
- Aluminum foil
- Ziplock bags
- Pots & pans
- Hot pad
- Spatula, slotted and regular spoons, & tongs
- Roasting forks
- Kitchen knife
- Cutting board
- Plates, bowls, & cups
- Forks, knives, & spoons
- Skewers
- Salt, pepper, & other seasonings
- Condiments
- Plastic dish tub
- Scrub brush
- Dish soap
- Small bottle of bleach (for sterilizing washed dishes, pots, etc.)
- Kitchen towels
- Paper towels
- Trash bags
- Charcoal
- Coffee pot
- Cork screw (Check out the TRUE TWISTICK)
